Technique used: Crochet



## MATERIALS

(75% Microdenier Acrylic/25% Rayon from bamboo; 3oz/85g, 251yds/230m):

#0002 Coral LipsticK (A): 1 (1, 1, 1) ball

#0003 Soft Sunshine (B): 1 (1, 1, 1) ball

#0004 Green Sheen (C): 2 (2, 2, 2) balls

One size US F-5 (3.75mm), or size to obtain gauge

One size US E-4 (3.5mm) (for edging)

Stitch markers (or small pieces of yarn)

Yarn needle

## SIZES

6 months (12 months, 18 months, 24 months)

## FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

**Chest:** 19 (20, 21, 22)"/48.5 (51, 53.5, 56)cm

**Length:** 10 1/4 (10 1/2, 11, 11 1/2)"/26 (26.5, 28, 29)cm

## GAUGE

In single crochet, 18 sts and 21 rows = 4"/10cm, with larger hook;

One motif measures about 1.75"/4.5cm across.

## STITCHES USED

Chain (ch), single crochet (sc), slip stitch (sl st)

**NOTES**

1. To change color in join of a round, work last stitch of round. Insert hook in first stitch of round, yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook. Fasten off old color. Proceed with new color.
2. Weave in ends as work progresses.

**JACKET****Notes:**

1. Skirting (lower portion) of jacket is made from 24 (24, 27, 27) motifs.
2. After motifs are completed, they are sewn into 8 (8, 9, 9) strips of 3 motifs each.
3. One long edge of each strip is trimmed. The trim is wider at the lower end of the strip, causing the jacket skirting to flare slightly. After the trim is complete, the strips are sewn together to complete the skirting.
4. The bodice is worked from the top of the skirting up.

**SKIRTING****Motif (make 24 (24, 27, 27))**

With larger hook and A, ch 4; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

**Round 1 (RS):** Ch 1, work 16 hdc in ring; join with sl st in first hdc and change to B—16 hdc. Fasten off A.

**Round 2:** With B, ch 1, (sc, ch 2, sc) in same hdc as join, \*sc in next 3 hdc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next hdc; repeat from \* 2 more times, sc in last 3 hdc; join with sl st in first sc and change to C—20 sc and 4 ch-2 sps. Fasten off B.

**Round 3:** With C, ch 1, sc in same sc as join, \*3 sc in next ch-2 sp, sc in next 5 sc; repeat from \* 2 more times, 3 sc in next ch-2 sp, sc in next 4 sc; join with sl st in first sc—32 sc. Fasten off.

With yarn needle and C, whipstitch motifs into 8 (8, 9, 9) strips of 3 motifs each.

**Trim Strips**

**Note:** Work trim across only one long edge of each strip.

With WS of one strip facing and larger hook, join C with sl st in corner of strip to work across one long edge.

**Row 1 (WS):** Ch 1, work 25 sc evenly spaced across long edge, turn—25 sc.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in first 11 sc, [ch 1, sk next sc, dc in next sc] 7 times, turn. Place a marker at the beginning of this row for top of strip.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in each dc, ch-1 sp, and sc across. Fasten off.

Repeat to work trim across one long edge of each strip.

**Join Strips**

Arrange strips, with long edges together and marked top edges all at same end. **Note:** The trimmed long edge of each strip should be next to the untrimmed long edge of the next strip. With yarn needle and C, sew long edges of strips together.

**BODICE****Notes:**

1. First row of bodice is worked across top (narrow) edge of skirting.
2. Bodice is worked in one piece to armholes. The piece is then divided for armholes, and the fronts and back worked separately.

With RS facing and larger hook, join A with sl st in top corner of skirting. **Note:** Top of skirting is narrower edge (marked).

**Row 1 (RS):** Ch 1 working across top edge of skirting, work 86 (92, 96, 100) sc evenly spaced across to opposite top corner, turn—86 (92, 96, 100) sc.

**Next 1 (3, 3, 5) Rows:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

**First Front**

**Row 1 (RS):** Ch 1, sc in next 17 (18, 19, 20) sc, turn; leave remaining sts unworked (for armholes, back, and second front)—17 (18, 19, 20) sc.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sk first sc (decrease made), sc in each sc across, turn—16 (17, 18, 19) sc.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, sk next sc (decrease made), sc in last sc, turn—15 (16, 17, 18) sc.

**Rows 4 and 5:** Repeat last 2 rows—13 (14, 15, 16) sc.

**Row 6–10 (12, 12, 14):** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

**Shape Neck**

**Row 11 (13, 13, 15):** Sl st across first 3 (4, 5, 6) sc, ch 1, sc in last 10 sc, turn—10 sc.

**Row 12 (14, 14, 16):** Ch 1, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, sk next sc, sc in last sc, turn—9 sc.

**Row 13 (15, 15, 17):** Ch 1, sk first sc, sc in each sc across, turn—8 sc.

**Rows 14 (16, 16, 18)–24 (24, 26, 26):** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Fasten off.

#### Back

**Row 1 (RS):** Sk next 7 (8, 8, 8) unworked sc following first front, join C with sl st in next sc, ch 1, sc in next 38 (40, 42, 44) sc, turn; leave remaining sts unworked (for armhole and second front)—38 (40, 42, 44) sc.

**Rows 2–5:** Ch 1, sk first sc (decrease made), sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, sk next sc (decrease made), sc in last sc, turn—30 (32, 34, 36) sc.

**Rows 6–22 (22, 24, 24):** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

#### shape first shoulder

**Row 1 (RS):** Ch 1, sc in first 8 sc, turn; leave remaining sts unworked (for neck and second shoulder)—8 sc.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. Fasten off.

#### shape second shoulder

**Row 1 (RS):** With RS facing, sk next 14 (16, 18, 20) unworked sc following first shoulder, join C with sl st in next sc, ch 1, sc in each remaining sc across, turn—8 sc.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. Fasten off.

#### Second Front

**Row 1 (RS):** With RS facing, sk next 7 (8, 8, 8) unworked sc following back, join C with sl st in next sc, ch 1, sc in each remaining sc across, turn—17 (18, 19, 20) sc.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, sk next sc (decrease made), sc in last sc, turn—16 (17, 18, 19) sc.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sk first sc (decrease made), sc in each sc across, turn—15 (16, 17, 18) sc.

**Rows 4 and 5:** Repeat last 2 rows—13 (14, 15, 16) sc.

**Row 6–10 (12, 12, 14):** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

#### Shape Neck

**Row 11 (13, 13, 15):** Ch 1, sc in next 10 sc, turn; leave remaining sts unworked—10 sc.

**Row 12 (14, 14, 16):** Ch 1, sk first sc, sc in each sc across, turn—9 sc.

**Row 13 (15, 15, 17):** Ch 1, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, sk next sc, sc in last sc, turn—8 sc.

**Rows 14 (16, 16, 18)–24 (24, 26, 26):** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Fasten off.

#### SLEEVES (make 2)

##### Notes:

1. Each cuff is made from 4 motifs.
2. After motifs are completed, they are sewn into a strip.
3. Each sleeve is worked from the top of a cuff up.

Make 4 motifs as for skirting. Arrange the motifs into a strip and, with C, whipstitch the motifs together. Do not trim the strip.

**Row 1 (RS):** With RS facing and larger hook, join C with sl st in corner of strip to work across long edge, ch 1, work 34 (34, 34, 36) sc across long edge to opposite corner, turn—34 (34, 34, 36) sc.

**Rows 2–6 (6, 4, 6):** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

**Row 7 (7, 5, 7):** Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn—36 (36, 36, 38) sc.

**Rows 8 (8, 6, 8)–25 (25, 25, 31):** Repeat Rows 2–7 (7, 5, 7), 3 (3, 5, 4) more times—42 (42, 46, 46) sc.

**Rows 26 (26, 26, 32)–29 (31, 33, 37):** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

#### Shape Cap

**Rows 1–4:** Ch 1, sk first sc (decrease made), sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, sk next sc (decrease made), sc in last sc, turn—34 (34, 38, 38) sc.

Fasten off.

#### FINISHING

Block pieces lightly, to schematic measurements, if desired.

With C, sew shoulder seams. Set in sleeves. Sew sleeve seams.

#### Edging



With RS facing and smaller hook, join A with sl st in back lower edge of jacket.

**Round 1 (RS):** Ch 1, sc evenly spaced across lower edge, up front edge, around neck edge, down other front edge, and across remaining lower edge, working 2 sc in each corner; join with sl st in first sc.

**Round 2:** Ch 1, sc in each sc around, working in corners as follows, and joining with sl st in first sc at the end of the round:

1. Work 2 sc in each lower front corner.
2. At beginning of right neck edge work (sc, ch 7, sc) (for loop).
3. At beginning of left neck edge work, ch 40, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in remaining 38 ch, sc in corner, ch 40, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in remaining 38 ch (for ties).

Using yarn needle, weave in all ends.



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
